WHEREAS: The study of the history of, workings of, influences on, and the

evolution of U.S. political thought, governmental systems, and political

processes is at the very core of citizenship and civic duty; and

WHEREAS: Civics awareness in Georgia is important in informing students of the

unique American experiment: our system of limited government with checks and balances designed to promote self-government through

individual responsibility; and

WHEREAS: We must study and learn from our nation's rich history to understand

what makes America special so that future generations can continue to

make the United States the best nation to live and work in; and

WHEREAS: It is important to encourage Georgia students, educators, parents, and

guardians to engage fully with civics awareness so our State has an educated and informed population aware of our government and its

capabilities; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby

proclaim October 2021 as CIVICS AWARENESS MONTH in

Georgia.
