24	adopt	to choose to take as one's own, to agree to
24	advocate (verb)	to recommend publicly, or speak in favor of
24	compromise	an agreement reached by each side making concessions to the other side. Neither side gets all of what they want.
24	Congress	a legislative body - in the United States, it is a bicameral (two part) system made up of the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives
24	Constitution	the principles, rights, and/or precedents by which a country, state, or organization agrees to be ruled
24	delegate	a person sent to represent others at an assembly or meeting
24	delegation	a group of representatives
24	Framers	the men who helped shape the Constitution of the United States of America
24	House of Representatives	one of the two houses of the bicameral United States Congress, established in 1789 by the Constitution of the United States. Representation on the house is based on population of the states, and they are elected every two years.
24	ingenious	something particularly clever or inspired
24	majority	the larger part of a population
24	partisanship	strong bias towards one's own cause or political beliefs and often an unwillingness to compromise
24	population	all the residents of a certain area
24	populous	having a large number of residents
24	proportionate	having the same or constant ratio in this case

24	representative	a person chosen to speak or act for others
24	senator	a member of the smaller, upper assembly in the U.S. Congress
24	tyranny	rule by a cruel and oppressive government, often without legal right
