47	appoint	choose for a particular task or job
47	Bill of Rights	the first ten amendments to the US Constitution, ratified in 1791 and guaranteeing such rights as the freedoms of speech, assembly, and worship.
47	Civil Rights	rights of personal liberty guaranteed to U.S. citizens by the 13th and 14th amendments to the Constitution and by acts of Congress
47	Cold War	a conflict of ideological differences carried on by methods other than military action and without breaking off diplomatic relations
47	committee	a group of people usually appointed or elected from a larger body to complete a function
47	Congress	a legislative body - in the United States, it is a bicameral (two part) system made up of the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives
47	Constitution	the principles, rights, and/or precedents by which a country, state, or organization agrees to be ruled
47	debate	argue about, often in a formal matter
47	elect	choose (someone) by voting to hold public office or some other position
47	House of Representatives	one of the two houses of the bicameral United States Congress, established in 1789 by the Constitution of the United States. Representation in the House is based on population of the states, and they are elected every two years.

47	legacy	something left to or given to you by your ancestors or predecessors
47	majority	the larger part of a population
47	succession	the process of inheriting or taking over a position
47	tenure	the holding of an office or position
