7	amend	change or update part of a text
7	amendment	a change or addition to a piece of legislation
7	Bill of Rights	the first ten amendments to the US Constitution, ratified in 1791 and guaranteeing such rights as the freedoms of speech, assembly, and worship.
7	Congress	a legislative body - in the United States, it is a bicameral (two part) system made up of the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives
7	Constitution	the principles, rights, and/or precedents by which a country, state, or organization agrees to be ruled
7	election	the formal organized choice (through voting) of an official
7	First Amendment	the first of 10 amendments making up the Bill of Rights. It protects freedom of speech, religion, and the press as well as the right to peaceful protest and to petition the government
7	freedom	the power or right to act, speak, or think as one wants, without hindrance or restraint
7	fundamental	of critical importance
7	generation	the average period, generally considered to be about thirty years, during which children are born and grow up, become adults, and begin to have children of their own
7	guarantee	an assurance for the fulfillment of a condition
7	irked	annoyed
7	proposed	offered for discussion or consideration
7	ratification	confirming by expressing consent, approval, or formal action
7	ratified	signed and made official
