96	alternating	occurring by turns or in succession
96	amend	change or update part of a text
96	American Revolution	The conflict (1775-1783) when the British colonies (now the United States of America) rebelled against British rule and fought and won the right to self-governance.
96	colony	a territory under the rule of another country
96	Congress	a legislative body - in the United States, it is a bicameral (two part) system made up of the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives
96	constellation	a group of related qualities or things; example: the Articles and Amendments of the Constitution
96	Constitution	the principles, rights, and/or precedents by which a country, state, or organization agrees to be ruled
96	constitutional	related to the principles, rights, and/or precedents by which a country, state, or organization agrees to be ruled.
96	Continental Congress	the delegates from the colonies that first met in 1774 in response to actions by the British government that the colonies found intolerable. They declared American independence from Britain in 1776 and ratified the Articles of Confederation.
96	desecration	disrespectful treatment of something
96	First Amendment	the first of 10 amendments making up the Bill of Rights. It protects freedom of speech, religion, and the press as well as the right to peaceful protest and to petition the government
96	inspired	led to do something as if by supernatural or divine influence
96	ironically	in a way that is opposite of what would be expected
96	Justice (Noun)	A judge on the Supreme Court

96	landmark case	a court case that established a significant new legal principle
96	liberty	the power or right to do as one pleases, to be free
96	orthodox	conforming to beliefs, attitudes, or modes of conduct that are generally approved
96	prescribe	to authoritatively declare something as a rule that should be carried out
96	revolution	forceable overthrow of a government
96	Samuel Adams	politician of the American Revolution, leader of the Massachusetts "radicals," delegate to the Continental Congress, and a signer of the Declaration of Independence
96	Sons of Liberty	grassroots group of instigators in colonial America who used extreme civil disobedience to intimidate loyalists. The most prominent Son of Liberty was Samuel Adams
96	Supreme Court	the highest judicial court
